

State of Iowa COVID-19 Response

Below is a summary of the of Governor Reynold’s seventh Emergency Disaster Proclamation compiled by attorneys Tim Coonan and Sydney Gangestad.

Her actions are authorized by Iowa Code Chapter 29C, Emergency Management and Security.

Additional Closures of Certain Establishments		
Section 1		<p>Order the following additional closures beginning at 8:00 a.m. on 4/7 and continuing through 11:59 p.m. on 4/30:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Malls—all enclosed malls, including interior common areas and retail establishments only accessible to public from interior. B. Tobacco or vaping stores C. Social and fraternal clubs—including, but not limited to American Legion or VFW posts, Elk Clubs, country clubs, and golf courses. Food or beverages may be sold if taken from premises; golf course clubhouses may be open to facilitate use of the golf course, provided social distancing practices are implemented. D. Amusement—bingo halls, bowling alleys, pool halls, arcades, and amusement parks E. Museums, libraries, aquariums, and zoos F. Racetracks and speedways G. Skating rinks/parks—indoor or outdoor roller- or ice-skating rinks/parks H. Playground—indoor or outdoor playgrounds or children’s play centers I. Campgrounds—all public and private campgrounds shall be closed to temporary recreational use; does not prohibit the use of a campground by a long-term or permanent tenant; all cabins and

Mass Gatherings		
Section 4		<p>Continue to suspend mass gatherings; social, community, spiritual, religious, leisure, and sporting gatherings and events of more than 10 people are prohibited until 11:59 p.m. on 4/30.</p> <p>A. Gathering of parked cars/vehicles excluded, if people remain in vehicles and windows/doors remain closed—no more than 10 in each vehicle.</p> <p>B. Planned large gatherings and events must be canceled or postponed.</p>
Section 5		<p>All auctions with more than 10 people present are prohibited until 11:59 p.m. on 4/30 at all venues. Livestock auctions that only include food animals may continue so long as there are no more than 25 people present in person (people in parked vehicles are not considered in the count of people present in person, see section 4).</p>

Section 6	Section 29C.18, 135.35	<p>All peace officers of the state are called upon to assist in enforcement of Governor's proclamations.</p>
Sales of Alcohol Extensions		
Section 7	Section 123.30(3)(c), 123.49(2)(d)	<p>Class "C" liquor holder may sell unopened bottles of wine or alcoholic liquor for consumption off premises if promptly taken from premises prior to any consumption via carry-out or drive-through, or delivery; effective until 11:59 p.m. on 4/30.</p>
Section 8	Section 123.130(4) 185 IA Admin Code § 4.6(3)(c) & (e)	<p>Continues to suspend provisions that require that beer sold at retail at the manufacturing premises for consumption off premises must be in-person and transferred to another container at the time of sale; effective until 11:59 p.m. on 4/30.</p>

Section 9	Section 123.30(3)(c), 123.49(2)(d)	<p>Class "C" liquor holder may sell mixed drinks or cocktails for consumption off premises if sealed with a lid (or other secure method) and is promptly taken from premises prior to any consumption via carry-out or drive-through, or delivery</p> <p>(Notes: Does NOT modify open container in motor vehicle laws sections 321.284 and 321.284A); effective until 11:59 p.m. on 4/30.</p>
Implementation & Interpretation		
Section 10		DPS, DPH, DOE, Iowa Homeland Security, and DOT are directed to monitor operation and implementation of the proclamation
Section 11		Nothing shall be construed as an exemption from any other provision of the Iowa Code or Admin Code unless specifically identified
Section 12		Effective immediately and expires 4/30 at 11:59 p.m., unless sooner terminated or extended
